I. SAC REPORT:

- Prof. Gonyeau noted that since the last senate meeting SAC has met twice.

III. NEW BUSINESS:

A. ACADEMIC PROPOSAL: GRADUATE COUNCIL PROGRAM IN THE COLLEGE OF SCIENCE

Prof. Di Credico read the following:

BE IT RESOLVED That the University establish the Master of Science in Nanomedicine in the College of Science as approved by the Graduate Council 22 September, 2022 (16-0-0).

Prof. Di Credico said there were many people involved in creating this new program.

She acknowledged Carla Mattos, Assoc. Dean of Graduate Affairs and Professional Programs for the COS. She said they are very excited about this program. It is on the cutting edge and there is a demand for it

right now and very few programs like this exist anywhere. This is an example of how Northeastern can be at the forefront of what is happening and really preparing students to enter the workforce knowledgeably in this area.

B. ACADEMIC PROPOSAL: GRADUATE COUNCIL PROGRAM IN THE COLLEGE OF ARTS, MEDIA AND DESIGN

Prof. Sivak read the following:

BE IT RESOLVED That the University establish the Master of Science in Creative Collaboration and Multidisciplinary Design in the College of Arts, Media and Design as approved by the Graduate Council 21 September, 2022 (16-0-0).

Prof. Sivak recognized Ian Canning, Assistant Dean for Mobility, Exec & Partnership Programs in CAMD. He said they are very excited about this experiential MA program. The verticals of this program are focused on what CAMD and Northeastern do very well – indesign, methodology, data driven communication and creative team collaboration. The held an industry roundtable in Seattle to get industry feedback on this program. This is about network engagement, engagement with the business community. It is very flexibly structured to engage employers across the network. It is a 32 credit degree. It establishes synergies across a lot of the departments and schools in CAMD. We are excited for the launch of this program.

Prof. Gonyeau said when reading the course proposal he noticed the flexibility. This is what students are looking for. This sort of accelerated option that offers completion in as little as 18 months. It will attract students into the program.
