RATIONALE

Following a series of conversations with department chairs, graduate program directors, and the Provost's Office, the College of Social Sciences and Humanities decided to pursue semester hour conversion across all of our graduate programs (from 3 semester hours per course to 4 semester hours per course).¹ There were multiple reasons why semester hour conversion made sense in the current context including, but not limited to:

- Cross-College Collaboration: Our 3sh courses often made cross college (and sometimes even within college) collaborations more difficult. Within the policy school, for example, we often had to develop 1sh modules to be taken simultaneously with 3sh courses so that students from other colleges could actually take our courses within the context of their own degree programs.
- Undergraduate Recruitment into Graduate Programs through PlusOne: Equally important, the 3sh courses in the graduate context made the PlusOne programs awkward to implement and confusing for undergraduate students. When on the undergraduate side of their PlusOne program, students were taking more difficult graduate courses within their undergraduate course load for *less* credit. Three semester hour graduate courses also meant that students could not take full advantage of the PlusOne benefit of having 16sh double-counted. CSSH students had to take five courses to get to 15sh. Fitting four graduate courses in on the undergraduate side is difficult, fitting five courses in (and still not achieving the maximum potential benefit) dis-incentivized the PlusOne option. PlusOne programs have been an important source of enrollments in our graduate programs and we have been working with the undergraduate programs to ensure that we see growth there in the future.
- Certificates: Current students have expressed a desire to pursue interdisciplinary studies through adding a certificate to their program. Certificates require a minimum of 12 semester hours of credit so in a 3sh model, students have to find room in their curriculum for four courses. In a 4sh model, all of the certificates can become 3 course certificates. All of our certificate program directors elected to move to a 3-course certificate through semester hour conversion. We believe this will help with both external and internal recruitment into certificate programs.

¹ The Economics department already has 4sh courses across its graduate programs.

- Co-op across the Graduate Programs: We were also in the process of adding a co-op option to all of our Masters' degree programs and working on an experiential integration course and curricular maps for the AY 18-19 implementation of graduate co-op. Pursuing conversion in this academic year made sense in the context of other graduate programs initiatives already underway.
- Modularity: We also see increased capacity for modularity (a university priority) within a 4sh context. Students can take full courses or more modular offerings of 1sh or 2sh.

PROCESS

Once all of the department chairs agreed that semester hour conversion made sense, we met with representatives of the Provost's Office to alert them to our intention to pursue SH conversion across the college.

All were in agreement that simply growing the semester hours required per program by 25% would not be sustainable, so all programs were asked to consider trimming their curriculum (usually by eliminating an elective or two) so that the total hours required for the degree program remained reasonably similar to that which is required now. This was particularly important in the Masters' degree programs where students pay per semester hour for their program.

We also held a series of meetings with the Registrar's Office team over the Fall semester to ensure that we prepared the proposed changes in a way that facilitated implementation and catalog updates. Both the Provost's Office and the Registrar's Office agreed that 30+ separate full proposals would be both overly burdensome (and unnecessary) and agreed that college-wide conversion should involve this single memo that would clearly articulate the purposes and process, followed by a series of curriculum maps that showed the changes visually.

Over the Fall 2018 semester, the CSSH Dean's Office worked with every graduate certificate and degree program to construct the enclosed semester hour conversion maps. Each unit head then took the maps and the proposed changes back to their full faculty for discussion and vote.

Curriculum Maps: For each certificate and degree program, the curriculum maps clearly show the *existing degree requirements* on the left (copied directly from the AY 17-18 catalog) and the *post-conversion degree requirements* on the right. We have highlighted the overall change to the programs (total semester hours required, broken down by required courses and electives) in the header for each certificate or degree program.

Governance: The relevant faculty for each of the certificate and degree programs have considered and voted on both semester hour conversion as a college-wide effort and the actual specific changes to their certificate and degree programs (e.g. the curriculum maps). The date

and outcome of those votes is reported by program in the brief descriptions of program by program changes that follow.

The CSSH Graduate Academic Advisory Committee (GAAC), comprised of five elected faculty representatives, were apprised of this effort across the semester, and was given an opportunity to review the full proposal along with all curriculum maps. The GAAC voted 5-0-0 on 1/22/2018 in favor of conversion and the proposed changes to the graduate degree programs across the college.

The Associate Deans of other colleges were informed of this effort during the November 5, 2017 meeting of the Graduate Studies Committee. All agreed to the proposal in principle and were provided with the complete package during the Graduate Studies meeting on 1/18/2018. There were no objections to the proposed CSSH semester hour conversion.

SUMMARY

The table that follows the program-by-program description provides a concise summary of the changes that are reflected in the curriculum map that follows. For quick reference it also includes the faculty vote and date of vote as well as the change in overall SH requirements pre-and post-conversion. As is evident in the table, across the Master's degree programs, most programs were able to eliminate one or two courses so that the 4sh program was only on average 1sh longer than the existing 3sh program. Units often had a more difficult time eliminating a course or two in the PhD Programs, so there the average increase in SH across programs is 3sh on average.

IMPACT ON COURSES

All 4sh courses will be scheduled for 3 hours and 20 minutes to meet the Carnegie requirement for contact hours. We have established suggested graduate course sequences that align with undergraduate sequences.

IMPACT ON EXISTING STUDENTS

Current graduate students will be held harmless. Unless they affirmatively opt into the new curriculum in writing, it will be presumed that they will be governed by the curriculum that was in the catalog in their academic year of first enrollment. Since the courses required to complete their degree will become 4sh courses beginning in Fall 2018, the College will provide a tuition credit to continuing students to cover the additional cost incurred to complete degree requirements.

School of Criminology and Criminal Justice

The faculty of the Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies' program voted in favor of semester hour conversion and the associated revised curriculums by a vote of 14-0-0 on January 19, 2018.
- The Master of Science in Environmental Science and Policy is a new program so there is no curriculum map for it in the catalog yet. We created the map, in collaboration with the College of Science, and have included it here. This curriculum was approved through the curricular review process in the Fall 2017 semester.
