2022-23 Senate Accomplishments and New 2023-24 Representatives

Last year's Faculty Senate concluded its service with a total of 35 resolutions reviewed and approved. Of these, ten authorized new or revised academic programs and seven involved amendments to the Faculty Handbook. Faculty committees also made recommendations in areas ranging from academic technology and library resources to climate justice actions and global education opportunities.



For 2023-24, Ted Landsmark, Distinguished Professor of Public Policy (CSSH), takes the gavel as chair of the Senate Agenda Committee. Yingzi Lin, Professor of College of Engineering (COE), will serve as SAC secretary. SAC will continue to invite faculty to make use of the Faculty Senate Concern Form launched last year to bring issues to our attention for further investigation. Among issues raised so far this year, SAC has followed up on questions

about faculty contract language (see below), the effects of the Supreme Court ruling on affirmative action, and emergency preparedness.

This year's SAC members wish to express our appreciation to outgoing SAC chair Michael Gonyeau, Clinical Professor of Pharmacy (Bouvé), for his leadership over the past two years, and to our dedicated support staff, Executive Assistant Joan Collins and Administrative Assistant Jonella Esposito.

Faculty Committee Appointments and Charges

SAC is grateful to all faculty who responded to the call for 2023-24 committee volunteers last spring. We appreciate everyone's willingness to contribute their time, energy, and ideas. With the goal of balancing committee memberships along the lines of continuing and new members, representation across colleges and disciplines, and both tenure-track and non-tenure track faculty, we have invited 67 faculty members to serve on the 13 appointed standing committees established in the Faculty Handbook. Updated lists of committee memberships and their charges for the year are being posted at <u>faculty.northeastern.edu/senate/committees</u>. Further appointments to ad hoc and search committees are expected throughout the year.

A common focus of this year's charges is the implementation of the One Faculty policy adopted in principle in 2019, which called for "minimizing the differences (with the obvious exception of tenure) in the rights and responsibilities between the various classifications of full-time faculty." Several committees will examine progress toward equity in areas such as representation, resources, and advancement opportunities available to fulltime non-tenure-track faculty.

Global Network and Faculty Keep Growing

At the September 13 Faculty Senate meeting, Provost David Madigan reported on the university leadership retreat held in Boston on August 29. The retreat was attended by around 300 faculty and administrators from all 13 campuses in the Northeastern University global network. Presentations and discussions focused on opportunities that the growth of the network brings. Provost Madigan noted that Northeastern added 264 full-time faculty positions in 2022-23, including 95 on the tenure track. About half of the tenure-track positions represented joint appointments across departments, schools, or colleges. With a similar number of new faculty positions expected in 2023-24, the administration is working to encourage earlier consultations with affected departments for potential joint appointments.

Faculty Concern Resolved: Part-time Contract Terms

SAC received a faculty concern regarding part-time faculty contracts. The concern involved Northeastern having two versions of the part-time contracts, one for online faculty and another for on-ground faculty in Boston, that contained different language regarding syllabi distribution. The Provost's office confirmed that the online contract template should align with the on-ground template, and these templates will be sent to College Deans for their online faculty.
