- 3. College of Engineering

- 5. College of Science
- 6. College of Social Sciences and Humanities
- 7. D'Amore-McKim School of Business
- 8. Khoury College of Computer Sciences
- 9. School of Law

40 Members for the Senate: Shared Governance Model

- 6 Administrators appointed by the Provost
 - Administrator = Any faculty member in a dean's, provost's or chancellor's office
 - Chairs/Directors included in full-time faculty group.
- Provost (who co-chairs sessions and votes only in ties)
- Faculty determine the meeting agendas via the Senate Agenda Committee
- Open meetings, ~2 per month

Senate Definition by the Board of Trustees

- The Faculty Senate, together with the Administration of the University, has the responsibility of maintaining and improving the academic standards of the University and making the functioning of the University more effective and harmonious.
- It is the highest faculty governance body in the University.
- It also coordinates activities among the various College faculties as well as those that involve both the administration and faculty of the University.

Responsibilities Assigned to Senate by the BOT

To act as a coordinating body:

establish mutually satisfactory academic goals and standards

To be consulted:

 on policies, proposals, and faculty concerns, including creation of new colleges, new campuses, and new departments

To be the final faculty body:

 to deliberate and act upon recommendations from university curriculum committees

To initiate consideration and recommendation:

on any matter of faculty concern

To undertake legislative and advisory functions:

 in connection with the work of the University, its President, and/or the Board of Trustees

To provide communication:

between the University faculty and the Administration

Senate Agenda Committee (SAC)

- Senate elects 6 SAC members
 - Includes Chair & Secretary positions
 - SAC Chair presides at Senate
- SAC responsibilities
 - Set the agenda for all Senate meetings
 - Staff standing committees; create ad hoc committees
 - Provide regular channel for consultation and communication between the faculty and administration
 - Represent the faculty on University-level committees
 - Meet at least once each year with the Academic Affairs
 Committee of the Board of Trustees

Recent Senate Activities

- Worked closely with the Provost's office and University administration regarding changes to teaching and learning, research and service as a result of COVID-19
- 2. Approved 10 new programs: 8 MS, 2 doctoral, 1 BS
- 3. Revised 5 programs: 2 PhD, 3 MS
- 4. Endorsed a student mental health guide for faculty and staff
- 5. Created standing Ombuds presentations at senate meetings once per semester

More of last year's Senate work

- 6. Reviewed student advising needs in combined majors
- 7. Established search committees for 3 deans, 1 director, and 6 chairs
- 8. Oversaw faculty evaluations for 12 administrators:2 deans, 9 chairs, 1 director
- 9. Oversaw 2 student academic appeals
- 10. Implemented criteria for developing and displaying faculty workloads
